Pattern & Tutorial Succulent Pumpkin Cozy By MJs Off The Hook Designs

The Succulent Pumpkin Cozy is an easy ribbed crochet pumpkin pattern. The cozy fits around a potted succulent. The step-by-step video shows how to make a potted succulent garden and crochet the pumpkin cozy. Cozy is worked in front post double crochet and double crochet stitches. The pattern works up quickly in super bulky weight yarn.

DIFFICULTY: Easy Written in Standard American Terms



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HOOKS

MATERIALS



Lion Brand Wool-Ease Thick & Quick 82% Acrylic, 10% Wool, 8% Rayon (6oz/170g/106yds/97m) shown in mustard, pumpkin, oatmeal, claret and fisherman 1 ball makes 2 small or 1 large pumpkin

US M/13 (9mm) or size needed to obtain gauge

Yarn Needle Polyester Fibrefill **Artificial Succulents** Artificial Moss/Gravel Floral Foam Glue Gun Small Pot (4" diameter by 3.5" height)

GAUGE

Large Pot (6" diameter by 5.5" height)



10 sts and 6 rounds equal to 4" in pattern

Small - 6.5" diameter by 3.5" height Large - 10" diameter by 5.5" height *stuffed

CONSTRUCTION

Succulent Pumpkin Cozy is worked using one strand of super bulky yarn #6. You may combine 2 strands of any bulky yarn #5 or 3 strands of worsted weight yarn to make the cozy. Cozy is worked from the bottom up. Put a succulent pot inside cozy and stuff it with polyester fiberfill. Turning ch counts as a stitch unless otherwise indicated. The exact amount of yarn is used. Try dropping a hook size if yarn runs out before cozy is made—step-by-step video for size small on YouTube.

SPECIAL STITCHES

Fpdc - Front Post Double Crochet: Yo (Yarn Over), insert your hook from front to back to front around the post of the next stitch, yo, pull up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull through remaining two loops on your hook.

Dc2tog - Double Crochet Decrease: Yo, insert hook through st, pull up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops on your hook, yo, go through next st, pull up a loop, yo, pull through 2 loops on your hook, yo, pull through remaining three loops on your hook.

SUCCULENT POT

Cut floral foam to fit the pot. Use glue gun to secure pieces if needed. Add gravel or cover with moss. Add succulent plants. Once satisfied with plant position, use glue gun to secure stems into foam. Fill in any open spots with moss.

Pumpkin Cozy
Small Cozy

Increase Rounds

Round 1: Magic Circle, ch 2 (does not count as st) work 8 dc in ring, pull ring tight, sl st in first dc to join—8 sts.

Round 2: Ch 2 (counts as 1 dc here and throughout), work 1 fpdc around first st, * 1 dc in next fpdc, work 1 fpdc around same st; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—16 sts.

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 dc in ch sp, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 2 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first dc to join—24 sts.

Round 4: Ch 2, work 1 fpdc around first dc, work 1 dc in next fpdc, work 1 fpdc around same st, *work 1 dc in next dc, work 1 fpdc around same st, work 1 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—32 sts.

Rounds 5-9: Ch 2, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 1 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—32 sts.

Decrease Round

Round 10: Ch 1, 1 sc in first st, *sk next st, work 1 sc in next st; rep from * around, sl st in first sc to join—16 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Large Cozy

Increase Rounds

Round 1: Magic Circle, ch 2 (does not count as st) work 8 dc in ring, pull ring tight, sl st in first dc to join—8 sts.

Round 2: Ch 2 (counts as 1 dc here and throughout), work 1 fpdc around first st, * 1 dc in next fpdc, work 1 fpdc around same st;

rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—
16 sts.

Round 3: Ch 2, work 1 dc in ch sp, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 2 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first dc to join—24 sts.

Round 4: Ch 2, work 1 fpdc around first dc, work 1 dc in next fpdc, work 1 fpdc around same st, *work 1 dc in next dc, work 1 fpdc around same st, work 1 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—32 sts.

Round 5: Ch 2, work 1 dc in ch sp, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 2 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first dc to join—48 sts.





Succulent Pumphin Cozy

PATTERN

Rounds 6-11: Ch 2, work 1 dc in first st, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 1 dc in each of next 2 sts, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first dc to join—48 sts.

Decrease Rounds

Round 12: Ch 2, sk st, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 1 dc2tog over next 2 sts, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—32 sts.

Round 13: Ch 2, work 1 fpdc around next post, * work 1 dc in next st, work 1 fpdc around next post; rep from * around, sl st in first fpdc to join—32 sts.

Round 14: Ch 1, 1 sc in first st and next st, *sk next st, work 1 sc in next 2 sts; rep from * around, ending with only 1 sc, sl st in first sc to join—21 sts. Fasten off and weave in ends.

Assembly

Put succulent pot inside the pumpkin cozy. Stuff polyester fiberfill around the pot to shape the pumpkin. Pull up cozy to cover the pot. Add more moss to fill in any gaps.
